

Walk of Fame

28" x 75"



This clever table runner, bed runner or foot warmer can be made from (3) different 10" squares, 1 yard background and 1 yd border. Make half square triangle units quickly and easily using the Square Me Up ruler! A 1/4" seam is assumed in this pattern.

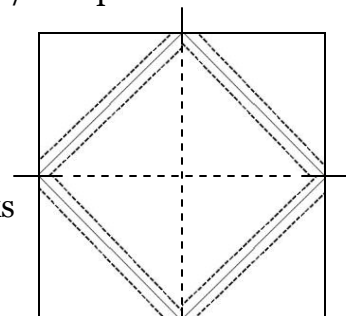
Cut the background fabric into:

- (1) strip 10" wide by the Width of Fabric. From this strip, cut (1) 10" x 10" square and (12) 4" x 4" squares. Cut the 4" x 4" squares on the diagonal to make 24 triangles.
- (1) strip 6-1/2" wide by the Width of Fabric. Cut this strip into (6) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares
- (1) strip 4-1/2" wide by the Width of Fabric. Cut this strip into (8) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares
- (5) strips 3" wide by the Width of Fabric for the first border.

Cut the border fabric into:

- (6) strips 5" strips by the Width of Fabric

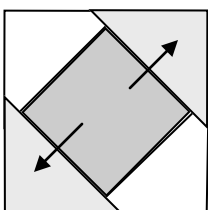
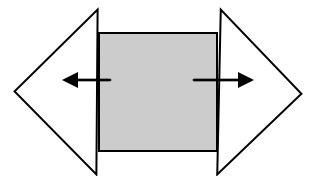
Choose the 10" square you will be using for the Half-Square-Triangle (HST) blocks in the Friendship Star block. Fold it in quarters (making a 5" x 5" square) and press. Place this square right sides together with the 10" background square.



Place the Square Me Up Ruler on point on the 10" background square, matching the corners of the ruler with the fold marks. Draw a line around the ruler. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the drawn lines, then cut on the drawn lines *and* the fold lines. You will have created (8) HST blocks. Press these to the dark and use the Square Me Up Ruler to square them up to 4-1/2" x 4-1/2".

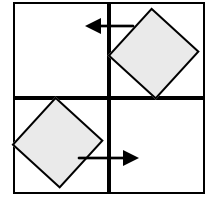
From the remaining two 10" squares, cut (6) 4-3/4" x 4-3/4" squares for the center of the Square-in-a-Square blocks and (2) 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares for the center of the Friendship Star blocks. Match the colors shown in the picture above or create your own design.

To make the Square-in-a-Square blocks, sew one of the background triangles to both sides of the (6) 4-3/4 x 4-3/4 squares. Use a *scant* 1/4" seam. Press to the triangle.

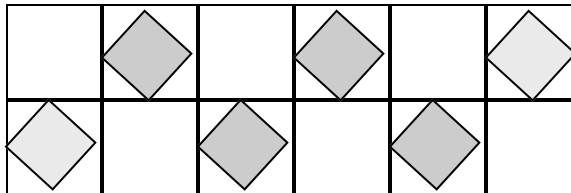


Sew a triangle to the remaining two sides of the blocks you just made. Use a *scant* 1/4" seam. Press toward the triangle. Use the Square Me Up ruler to square these blocks to 6-1/2" x 6-1/2".

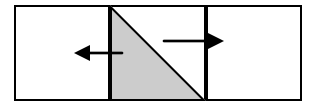
Sew each of these blocks to the right side of a 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" background square. Press to the background square. From these two-patch blocks, make (3) four-patches like the one to the right. Be sure to arrange the two-patch blocks so that only the center block has identically colored square-in-a-square blocks. (see below)



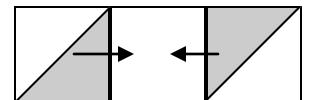
To make the center of the table runner, sew these three blocks together so the square-in-a-square blocks create a path like so:



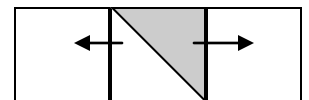
To make the Friendship Star blocks, sew a 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" background square to both sides of a Half-Square-Triangle Block. Make (4) sets. Press to the 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" background square.



Sew a Half-Square-Triangle block to both sides of the remaining two 4-1/2" x 4-1/2" squares. Press to the center square.



Sew the three rows together to make a Friendship Star block. Press and square up to 12-1/2" if necessary.

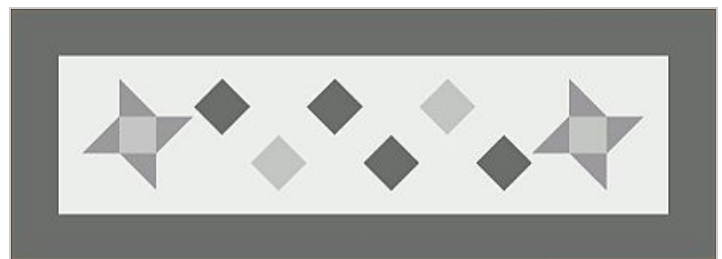


Sew a Friendship Star block to both ends of the center of the table runner. Press. Measure the top through the center the long way. It should measure 60-1/2"

Sew the five 3" wide strips end to end, mitering the join if you prefer. Cut two strips 60 1/2" long. Sew a strip to both sides of the tablerunner top, matching the center of the top with the center of the strip. Ease to fit if necessary. Cut two more strips 17-1/2". Sew these to the top and bottom of the top. Press to the border.

Sew the border strips end to end, mitering the join if you prefer. Cut two strips 65-1/2" long and sew them to both sides of the tablerunner top, matching the center of the top with the center of the strip. Ease to fit if necessary. Cut two more strips 26-1/2". Sew these to the top and bottom of the top. Press to the border.

You are done! Now just bat, back and quilt your top - this is a great one to use to practice your free style machine quilting. Enjoy!
